East Coast GRC

Bedok was one of the earliest documented places in Singapore as seen from a 1604 map referring to Sungei Bedok. In the past, the East Coast area used to be dotted with kampong houses. Being near the coast, many of the kampongs in the area were initially fishing settlements of nomadic communities, such as the Orang Laut, as well as inhabitants from the Indonesian archipelago and Malaya. Today, East Coast continues to embrace the kampong spirit by bringing people together through shared interests and causes, expanding their social networks, and building a community together.

When visiting various heritage sites, refrain from making too much noise out of respect. Together, let's create a pleasant experience of our cultural heritage!

1 SAN QING GONG TEMPLE

21 Bedok North Avenue 4

Known for having the tallest shrine in Singapore, San Qing Gong is a renowned Taoist Temple founded in March 2003. The spectacular temple structure is adorned with ornately designed soaring dragons coiled around stone-crafted pillars.

2 SIMPANG BEDOK POST OFFICE

350 Bedok Road

Simpang Bedok was one of the locations selected for new post offices under the Postal Development Plan between 1961 and 1963. The post office was intended to be a simple, yet functional building—with the upper floor serving the resident postmaster and the ground floor catering to the public.

3 PALELAI BUDDHIST TEMPLE

49 Bedok Walk

Founded by a Thai monk, the Palelai Buddhist Temple has been sited at its present location since 1968. Upon walking into the temple, visitors will be greeted by a large golden statue of Buddha, hand-crafted murals and a serene atmosphere for worship.

SEAFRONT HOMES

📍 Opposite 462 Upper East Coast Road

Located by the seafront, the housing estates in the East Coast are built in a variety of architectural styles such as Bauhaus and Art Deco.

Many of these houses were built in the 1940s and include intricate detailing, large driveways, sea-facing gardens and cooling features within the house such as ventilation grills at the top of the walls to allow the cool sea breeze to circulate within their homes.

Today, though few of these former seaside residences and restaurants remain, many are fondly remembered by old photographs and Malay films from the 1950s and 1960s.

SREE RAMAR TEMPLE

📍 51 Changi Village Road

Located at the junction of Changi Village road and Loyang Avenue, Sree Ramar Temple is an amalgamation of three temples and is adorned with regal sculptures of Hindu deities. Interestingly, the temple also houses non-Hindu deities, such as Lord Buddha and Guanyin (Goddess of Mercy).

MASJID AL-TAQUA

📍 11A Jalan Bilal

Built in 1883, this Masjid was a favoured place of worship for villagers living in kampongs around Bedok. Today, it continues to serve the residents living in Bedok by holding regular religious classes.

The Changi Chapel Museum is dedicated to Singapore's history focusing on the Second World War and the Japanese Occupation of Singapore. Visitors can view photographs, drawings and letters by prisoners and take a 45-minute guided tour around the site.



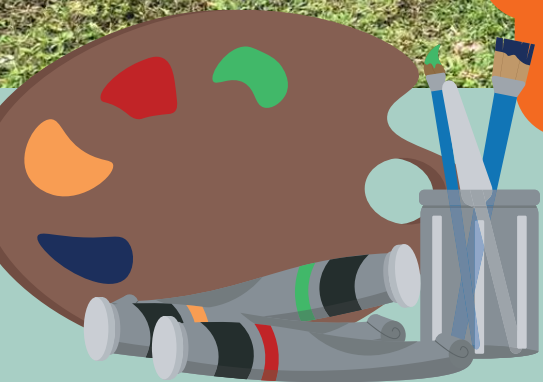

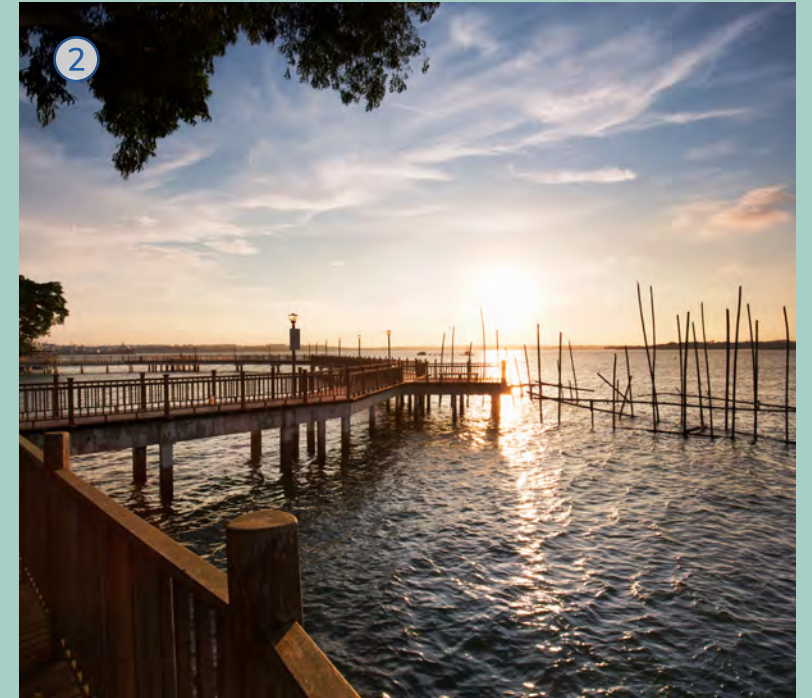

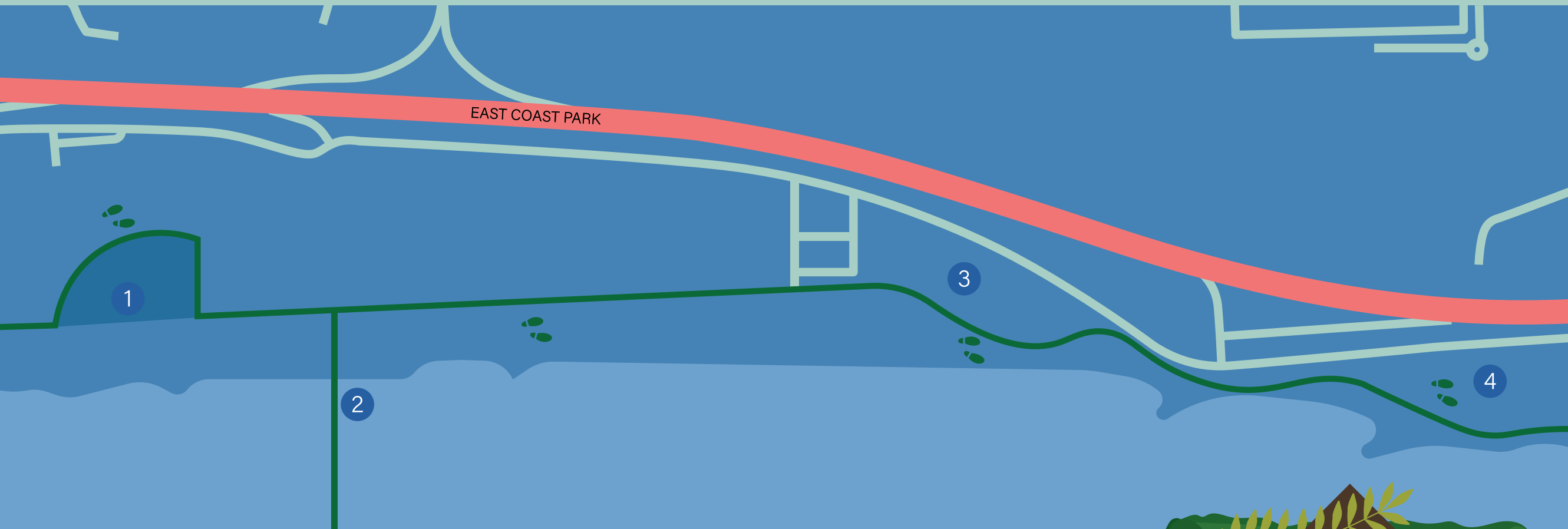
